WHAT'S IN A NAME?

In my discussions with Nancy Rowland prior to her retirement, she talked about many of the hopes she had for this congregation. But one hope that she addressed with great passion was the hope for a new name for the "White Gift" donations and offerings. We could trace the name back in our own memories to the olden days when church folk, especially in the South, would wrap food items in white paper and bring them to church at Christmas time. A little research has yielded the following tidbit of trivia:

The Presbyterian Church resource files credit the beginning of White Gift Sunday to the wife of a Methodist minister in 1904 in Ohio. She knew the legend of the Chinese people who loved their king so much that they each brought him a gift on his birthday. The gifts were all wrapped in white paper in order to emphasize the love of the people and the intent of the gift, not the size or value of it. The minister's wife and his daughters asked their congregation to bring a gift wrapped in white for their king, Jesus. These were often packages of food, the kind of thing that even the poorest in the congregation could bring. They were Christmas love gifts to be distributed to people in need in their community. This beautiful idea quickly spread around the Christian world in the early 1900s, and is still celebrated today as White Gift Sunday.

So – from Methodists in Ohio, recalling the Chinese and their devotion to their king made known through gifts wrapped in white paper – to New Castle Presbyterian today, and your donations of money, non-perishable goods and toiletries, none of which are wrapped in white paper. Seems a bit of a stretch.

What does a name like "White Gift" communicate to those who don't know the history or tradition? Nancy left with the hope that we could come up with something that speaks of the nature and spirit of such giving more plainly. I second that emotion, and the Deacons and I would welcome your ideas!

(and, while you are thinking on such things, I have also heard from some folks about the name "Someplace Else", and what it has felt like to them. Is it time for a name change there, too?)

National Night Out - Thank You!

National Night Out took place on Tuesday night in New Castle, and by all accounts was a big success! I'm not sure of the exact numbers in terms of turnout, but there was a nice showing of people, particularly families (I would estimate 200-250 people) that joined us for the evening, and the weather was perfect.

I've included some photos from the event, including the activities at our booth. I thought the set up and the offerings we had were great. We distributed lemonade, juice boxes and water for beverages; watermelon slices, granola bars and fruit popsicles for snacks; and there were a variety of games and activities for children to play.

Our NCPC materials were displayed nicely, and we also shared information about Spirit of Christmas. We had a few individuals who stopped by interested in our congregation, and we invited them to join us one Sunday to learn more.

All in all, a great, fun evening that brought our community together and gave NCPC enhanced visibility - one I think we'd participate in again. Many thanks to everyone who helped in some way: Jo, Joan, Diana, Patti, Cork, Peter, Bev, Kris and I'm sure others who I may have inadvertently left off.
