### **Back-to-School Night** **For Parents**

It's almost time for another school year, and with it the usual issues of helping our children for re-entry! - Getting the most out of Parent/Teacher nights

The evening will be led by a trio of experienced public school educators who are also parents: Gene Mayhew, Amy Selheimer and Janet Spring. The event is designed for parents of children K-8. Free coffee and iced drinks will be available.

## **Meeting House to Be Air-Conditioned**

At its meeting on June 28, the Session voted to proceed with air-conditioning the 1707 Meeting House in which we worship each Sunday. The proposal was presented at request of the Worship Committee and was then researched and given a project recommendation by the Trustees. Advice was received from other congregations who worship in buildings close to the age of ours, as well as from the trustees of other historic properties. The proposal was diligently discussed by the Worship Committee, the Resource Development Committee, the Trustees, and finally the Session. The Session meeting on June 28 included a hearing of the proposal from the recommended contractor, Carl Wolf of Service Unlimited, and feedback from members of the congregation. The reasons for approval of the project were

- The comfort and health and active participation of our members
- The stabilization of summer worship attendance
- The protection of our building and its contents from mildew and mold
- The avoidance of the uncertainty of last-minute worship set-up in the Fellowship Hall on especially hot and humid Sundays
- The availability of the Meeting House for additional summer events, including weddings
- The increased viability of our worship experience in attracting new members

The motion adopted by Session was “to approve Service Unlimited, Inc. as the general contractor for installation of air-conditioning in the sanctuary at a total cost not to exceed \$43,000. Costs exceeding this amount would require separate approval by the Session. Installation shall begin as soon as reasonably practical. Installation costs shall be paid from invested church funds. A capital campaign shall be conducted in early 2011 soliciting pledges to be paid over a three-year period with total repayment by December 31, 2014. The Session will also explore grants and other fundraising for this purpose.”

The next steps in this process will be

- For the Trustees to supervise the contractor in the immediate pursuit of needed permits and approvals.
- For the Resource Development Committee to meet for planning the financial repayment of the project
- For the Treasurer to proceed with the necessary liquidation of invested funds for the short-term payment of our obligations to Service Unlimited.

The Session has already received several \$1000 gifts from members for this purpose. Contributions toward this project may be received at any time. Contributors need not wait until the winter campaign.

The air-conditioning may be operational as early as late this summer.

### Questions and Answers from the information session:

*Where will the downspout be?* Next to chimney on the south side, then around the corner near the ground to the condensers on the river side.

*Where will the condensation go?* Copper pipes will be installed across attic with minimal soldering (fire risk procedures fully taken). Collection pans to be installed for any leakage.

*Will the air-conditioning need to be on without break between May and October?* The unit will be programmable according to our needs.

*How much in advance of use should the unit be activated?* Temperature should drop quickly, since the humidistat will be on. The unit will learn how early to come on before maximum use.

*Will there be space issues?* The ballast for the florescent lights can be moved somewhat.

*What is the maintenance service agreement?* \$895 per/yr.

*What about the efficiency of our doors and windows?* The greater problem is the entry of 200 hot people ("sensible load"). Entry of worshippers should be accommodated within 2 degrees fluctuation. Target temperature is 72 degrees.

*Does the historic nature of the building demand constant temperature?* Actually, it advises constant humidity control which can be set separately.

*What is the schedule for installation?* Three weeks total with an aggressive schedule. No evidence of ongoing installation on Sunday mornings.

*Is there a discount for off-season installation?* No, they are just as busy in the off-season as in the summer.

*Is there flexibility on the payment schedule?* Yes.

*Is there a performance warranty?* Mr. Wolf referred us to his references. The jobs most similar to ours are Red Clay Creek and Lower Brandywine Presbyterian Churches, as well as the Hagley "First House".

*Will the sound be as evident as it is in the fellowship hall?* There should be no sound whatsoever.

*What will the finish be on the bell tower returns?* They will be 24" x 24" wooden grills with the finish to be approved by us.

*How adequate was the survey of our building? Will there be surprises upon installation?* Survey of the building was extensive. There will be no increases by Service Unlimited.

*What about the conduits?* Enclosed, but the cavity can be accessed near the stairwell.

*What will the temperature in the balcony be?* Within 1-1/2 to 2 degrees of the floor.

*Can we over-ride the thermostat on a nice day?* Yes, a 3-hour over-ride is standard. The unit can be turned off in the event of a pleasant day.

*How complicated is the thermostat?* The thermostat will be very basic for easy use.

*What will be the increase in the general budget?* Up to \$3000 overall.



## **Seminary Student Program** **We Welcome Tom Euston**

The Session has employed Tom Euston as a seminary student intern to work with our congregation beginning September 7, 2010. Tom is an elder at Pencader Presbyterian Church in Glasgow and is currently a second-level student at Lancaster Theological Seminary in Lancaster, PA. He lives at 125 Piano Dr, Harmony Woods, in Newark, with his wife Marie.

Tom will be working with us 10 hours per week for 24 weeks. This work will satisfy field education requirements for his seminary education. At New Castle Presbyterian he will be working on his development of biblical, preaching, and pastoral skills. He will also be responsible for leadership development in the areas of youth/families and new member outreach. This means he will be teaching Bible Study, helping to lead worship each week, preaching every six weeks, visiting members, and meeting with leaders of our youth and outreach programs.

He will be supervised by Pastor Nancy and a lay committee composed of Monty Gerhart, Jim Whisman, Amy Selheimer, Conchita Showell, and Bev Stoudt. It is hoped that Tom's ministry in our midst will stimulate energy and interest for new directions. This new program is being funded by a very generous gift from one of our members. We look forward to this new relationship – please be sure to introduce yourself to Tom when he arrives in our midst in September!

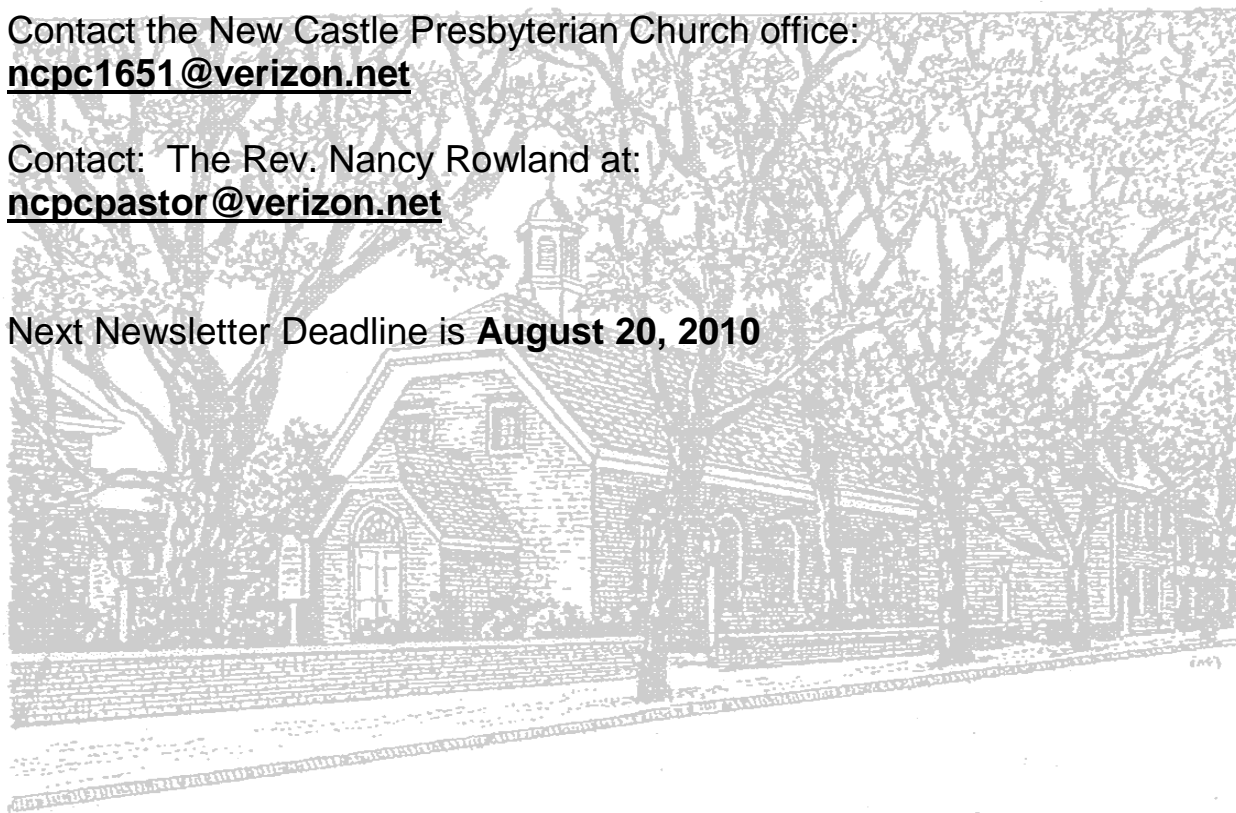
